We collaborate with all federal, state, and local agencies that provide business consulting, mentoring, planning, education, and funding support for startup or growth opportunities to connect our military community business owners.

Housing

We collaborate and provide support in the following areas, but not limited to, the purchase of a home, renting, homelessness, retirement community placement, and assisted living.

We collaborate with Veteran Service Organizations, the Department of Defense & military installations, non-veteran entities, and individuals to navigate veterans, military serving, and family members to resources that promote mental wellness, physical health, wealth, and morale.

ABOUT NAVIGATION SERVICES

On average, 6 hours are spent within each navigation service request guiding our veterans, military serving, and their families towards resources.

Included in those 6 hours

01

Intake

An initial intake session that allows the navigation team to get to know the member and learn more about the need to then determine which navigation pathway they will take.

02

Support

Supporting navigation pathways such as career opportunities, business launch and growth, housing benefits, and repairs, exploring the right education benefits, and so much more.

03

Resource Review

A review of all the resources we have in our toolbox navigating towards or providing tools, mentorship, or resources, and connections.

04

Collaboration and Connection (Navigation)

Introduction emails and registration links to connect them to the resources or people within the communities they live in.

05

Navigational Beacon

Follow up to make sure they get the answers they need or are still on the right path, to let them know we are here as a **NAVIGATIONAL BEACON** to help redirect if needed.

06

Ongoing Support

Continue to provide information to attend workshops or events they would benefit from.

Each request is unique and different that takes different pathways. Some are directed to veterans resources, some are directed to Idaho community resources, and some are navigated to both.

Navigation Services Accomplishments

- Provided navigation services, outreach, and support to 152 home buyers or coordinated home repair requests.
- Built partnerships with the Idaho Associated General Contractors and Paul Davis who
 have donated to date 32 sheds to veterans and the Idaho Veterans Garden through
 the Construction Combine in Meridian, Idaho.

- Supported several Veteran Service Organizations in their efforts to carry out their mission through donations, fundraising, and event support.
- Donated \$10,469.23 to Veteran Service Organizations.

Executive Director's Award - Idaho Power



Idaho Power has not only recognized the value veterans bring to the workforce but has also taken significant steps to foster a welcoming environment where veterans can thrive. Through dedicated programs and initiatives, they have created pathways for veterans and their families, ensuring they have the resources, support, and opportunities needed for success. They have actively been working with the Idaho **Veterans Chamber of Commerce to accept SkillBridge Interns** and recently committed to partnering with the Chamber to accept apprenticeship veterans and service members transitioning. They have been an annual sponsor for providing free navigation and membership services, as well as supporting the Shark Tank Business Pitch competition awarding cash prizes. They attend almost every big event from golf tournaments, to galas, to luncheons we have hosted over the years.

Housing Partner Award - West Ada Career and Technical Education

West Ada CTE was selected for their dedication and willingness to take on the build of the Chambers first two tiny homes project through their Center for Technical Education students. They have neared completion of 1 and are beginning the 2nd one to have walls and a roof before winter sets in and intend to have the two tiny homes available for gifting whether that be to land if we have secured some for the future Tiny Homes Village, or Veterans that are able to accept and use a Tiny Home for affordable housing.



Micron Workforce Partner of the Year



In 2024, The Idaho Veterans Chamber of Commerce was awarded an industry sector grant in partnership with the Micron Foundation to continue to grow their reach across all of Idaho through the Workforce Development Council. Micron has been instrumental in providing support and continuously engages with the Chamber to connect with career seekers and support housing/tiny homes initiatives, and they were awarded their DoD SkillBridge Agreement in 2024 creating pathways for transitioning service members to have opportunities to acclimate to the civilian sector through an internship program that assists the service member and their families in transition.

They have a very active and engaged Veterans Employer Resource Group that is a model for other employers to follow.

Idaho National Laboratory Veteran and Family Employer of the Year



INL has gone above and beyond to make a lasting impact, supporting veterans not just as employees but as integral members of their community. Their commitment to veteran hiring, mentorship, and support programs stands as a model for other companies. They have a Veterans Council that actively supports Veteran initiatives and have a dedicated position that works with the military in transition, veterans, and their families. They have accepted 4 SkillBridge interns over the last year with more on the horizon. Their commitment to hiring veterans and providing

horizon. Their commitment to hiring veterans and providing meaningful career development opportunities has allowed service members to feel at ease with their transition. It also recognizes their efforts to create a culture that values the skills, leadership, and integrity veterans bring to the table. INL has also been a

contributing donor and sponsor to keeping navigation services free. They have awarded grants, and beneficiary funds, and encouraged their employees to donate to the Chamber totaling over \$35,000 in funding. They are also an annual sponsorship member.

Idaho State University – Veterans Services Center has been an active member of the Chambers Education Steering Committee in supporting all initiatives that have been put forward to bridge the gaps. Todd Johnson and his team without hesitation volunteered to host this years 3rd Annual Veterans Partner Education Summit at the Pocatello campus where there were record breaking numbers of attendees in both person and virtually. The accommodation provided was top notch in providing space and the technology for a very successful 3-day summit. In addition, they also were a recipient of a SkillBridge Internship transitioning from the Military Service and provided him civilian transitioning experience

to working in the community, and that service member is currently working for ISU and going to school with ISU. ISU's desire to take care of Veterans in every way is truly remarkable and is making a difference one service member at a time.

They support Veterans in getting connected to their VA Home Loan Benefits and so much more. They have supported the Chambers annual golf tournament over the years, and have been exceptional partners to collaborate with.


